

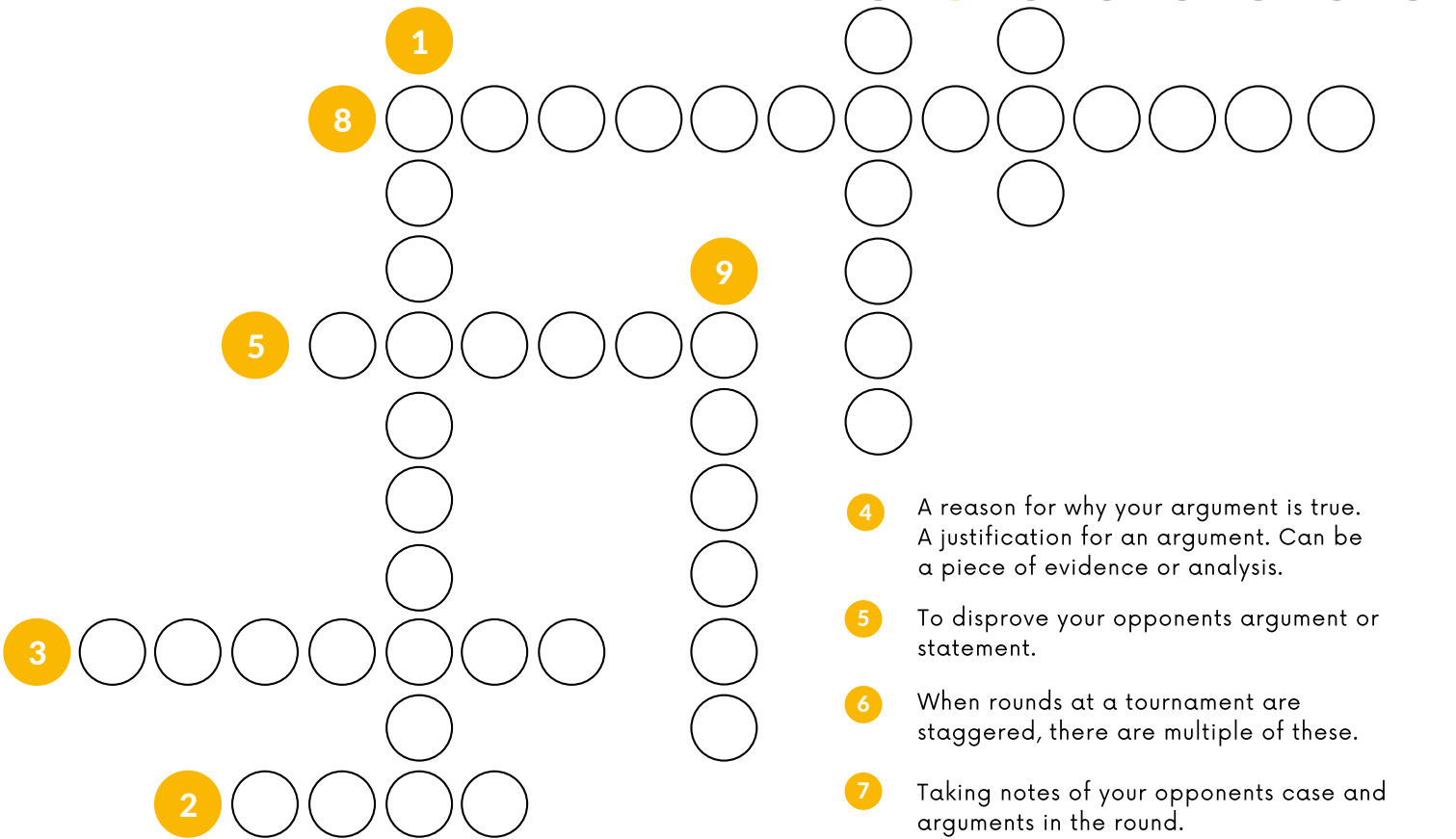

DEBATE TERMS WORKSHEET

This worksheet tests debaters understanding of common debate terms.

- 1 Information regarding specifics of rounds, including times, sides, rooms, judges, opponents, and more. Also a section on Tabroom.
- 2 A pre-written speech with evidence and analysis to present the initial arguments for either side.
- 3 At tournaments with "out-rounds", where teams with certain records advance, these are what are known as the rounds everyone is guaranteed. Typically 4-7.



- 4 A reason for why your argument is true. A justification for an argument. Can be a piece of evidence or analysis.
- 5 To disprove your opponents argument or statement.
- 6 When rounds at a tournament are staggered, there are multiple of these.
- 7 Taking notes of your opponents case and arguments in the round.
- 8 A score assigned in addition to wins/losses. Can be a factor in rankings, and many tournaments have an award specifically for this score.
- 9 To carry across the flow
- 10 To advance to the next round after preliminary rounds
