

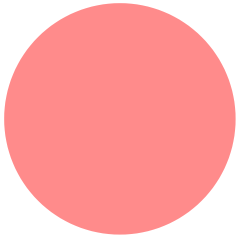

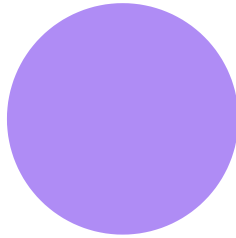
# ETHOS, LOGOS, PATHOS

Below, we will give you an argument. Circle or highlight it in a specific color based on whether it appeals to ethos, logos, or pathos.

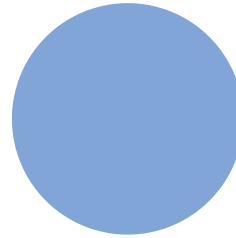
ETHOS
